4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) relates to a site inspection of Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) No.14 at West Cross Inn on the 10nd July 2025. The weather was dry during our visit and on the days preceding the inspection. We were accompanied by

DCWW staff.

In addition to the inspection report, I have also reviewed the Event Duration Monitoring (EDM) 2024 data submitted to us and any completed actions from previous CARs.

The permit for CSO No.14 at West Cross Inn allows the discharge of storm sewage as defined by the permit conditions via Washinghouse Brook to the top of Swansea beach.

During the inspection it was established that the CSO is on a 1-3 month maintenance schedule. The frequency of visits is determined by known risks and information gathered during visits.

The point of overflow appeared to be in inspection chambers about 12 metres upstream of the location given in the permit. The discharge point was at the location described in the permit with any spills entering the culverted section of Washinghouse Brook before it flows onto the beach.

The overflow setting of 400 l/s is not controlled by any flow devices or penstocks. The recorded number of spills indicates that the flow passed forward is being achieved. The overflow chamber was clean with no signs of debris or indications that it had recently been full.

As required by the permit a 10mm screen was fitted. As the storm sewage can overflow on either side of this CSO 2 static screens were fitted. Both were free of any debris. When this storm overflow is classified under Guidance Note 066 Classifying Storm Overflow Performance it is likely to be classified as Substandard due to the lack of a 6mm screen.

You informed us that, prior to work being carried out on the culverted watercourse, the screens were regularly blinded by debris from the stream. Since this work has been done by the local authority you have not been experiencing this issue.

The discharge from this CSO is subject to a spill trigger limit of 5 during the bathing water season. The submitted EDM for 2024 data shows that there were 2 spills during the bathing season lasting for a total of 0.75 hours. During the whole of 2024, 5 spills occurred lasting for a total of 2.5 hours.

The EDM monitor was located in the overflow chamber at a slightly different place to the permitted point of overflow as described earlier and reported data for 99.91% of the time in 2024. We could see that a signal booster had recently been installed. If necessary, a storm sewage sample could be taken from the overflow chamber.
