4. Details of our assessment

Bayliss Recovery Limited Site Visit, Bridgend (BB3192FJ) – 21/08/2025

Waste Regulation Officer Gareth Morris accompanied by Waste Regulation Officer; Dan Hopkin and Enforcement Officer; Clive Walker visited Bayliss Recovery Limited, Princes Way, Bridgend Industrial Estate, Bridgend, CF31 3AQ on 21/08/2025 to conduct a routine site inspection and to assess compliance with environmental permit; BB3192FJ).

The operator holds a: Tier Three (3) bespoke permit for metal recycling and end-of-life vehicle depollution and dismantling.

On arrival at site, we were met by the site director who kindly showed us around the site.

Weather on day of inspection, was clear, dry with little wind.

Breaches Recorded

W1A- General Management

Route Cause Breach 1.1.1

Permit Condition 1.1.1 (A) states: *The operator shall manage and operate the activities:*

- a. *In accordance with a written management system that identifies and minimises risks of pollution, including those arising from operations, maintenance, accidents, incidents, non-conformances, closure, and those drawn to the attention of the operator as a result of complaints.*

Permit Condition 1.1.2 states: *Records demonstrating compliance with rule 1.1.1 shall be maintained.*

During my inspection of the site, I asked for access to the permitted site's environmental management system (EMS) and all other paperwork relating the permitted site. I was told that the site office is locked, and no paperwork can be provided or accessed.

Action: I informed the permit holder that it was vital that the site permit, environmental management system and other associated documentation is always available. As the permit holder had breached this permit condition, I informed them that they would receive a Category Three (3) breach for this breach of permit condition.

Areas assessed as compliant and other comments can be found below.

Permit Condition 1.1.4 states: *The operator shall comply with the requirements of an approved competence scheme.*

The site's Technically Competent Manager visits the site regularly and holds an up-to-date WAMITAB certification that expires in February 2026.

W2C- Operating Techniques

Permit Condition 2.3.2 states: Wastes shall only be accepted if:

- A. It is of a type and quantity listed in schedule 2 table(s) S2.1 (S2.2 etc.); and
- B. It conforms to the description in the documentation supplied by the producer and holder.

The site accepts a number of waste codes. All waste was correctly segregated. There was no evidence of mixed/contaminated waste within any of the waste storage areas or containers.

W2E-Waste Acceptance

Permit Condition 4.2.2 states: Within one month of the end of each year, the operator shall submit to Natural Resources Wales using the form made available for the purpose, the information specified on the form relating to the site and the waste accepted and removed from it during the previous year.

The site accepts a number of waste codes. Annual returns have been received on time. The annual returns have been checked against the sites waste codes and are correct.

W2F- Technical Requirements

Permit Condition 2.4.1 states: *The storage (including temporary storage) and treatment of waste motor vehicles shall meet the requirements of article 6(1) of the End-of-Life Vehicles Directive.*

During the site inspection, the self-contained ELV depollution area was looked at. The operator uses very modern methods to extract all fuels, oils and liquids from ELV vehicles and disposes of the wastes from these vehicles correctly. In the event of any hydrocarbon pollutants leaking, the operator has a good spill policy and spill equipment in place to mitigate this.
