4. Details of our assessment

This compliance assessment report is being produced following a review of the waste returns and Technically Competent Manager provision for Llwynfynwent.

The review has been conducted by Luke Taylor (Senior Waste Regulation Officer) of Natural Resources Wales (NRW).

The following non-compliance has been identified:

W4B - Reporting - Permit Condition 6.1.1 - Category 3

You have been scored for the above breach as no waste returns have been submitted to NRW since 2020. This has been highlighted on the previous Compliance Assessment Reports below:

- CAR (Report ID: CAR_NRW0037371) dated 12th February 2021
- CAR (Report ID: CAR_NRW0038325) dated 23rd June 2021
- CAR (Report ID: CAR_NRW0043442) dated 12th February 2024
- CAR (Report ID: CAR_NRW0045923) dated 7th January 2025

In order to rectify this breach, please submit waste returns for all wastes imported to and removed from the site for the following financial years: 2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024 by 31st October 2025. This will enable Natural Resources Wales to track waste and identify whether waste is being handled correctly, in line with regulations and the waste duty of care.

These waste returns must be submitted even if the site did not accept or remove any waste during these reporting periods. Under permit conditions 5.3.1 and 5.3.3, records should have been maintained of all wastes accepted and dispatched from the site, so this should be an achievable time frame.

Should the waste returns not be submitted by the deadline below, NRW will consider issuing an enforcement notice under the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016 in response to the ongoing permit non-compliance.
