3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

You are non-compliant with your permit.

We are currently considering taking enforcement action against you for the non-compliance recorded above. We will contact you in due course.

4. Details of our assessment

Note: EDM operational time data was originally submitted to NRW in February 2025. DCWW then resubmitted the data with corrections in May 2025. This assessment has therefore been made using the resubmitted data.

During a routine compliance assessment check that we have carried out on 08 October 2025 it was noted that the EDM operational time for this asset was less than the minimum of 90%.

The operational time provided in the 2024 EDM Annual return for BG0027001 Cribyn Wastewater Treatment Works (WwTW) was 68.95%.

Condition 3.2.1 states that “The operator shall, unless otherwise agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales, undertake the monitoring specified in the following tables in schedule 3 to this permit: (a) point source emissions specified in table S3.1 and table S3.4”

Guidance for scoring the non-operational time suggests that this may have had a CCS category 4 breach.

Category 4: when the EDM is operational for 60.01-89.99% of the calendar year. It's reasonably foreseeable that there will be no environmental impact as the % indicates that the overflow is receiving reasonable monitoring and that the operator is likely to have reacted to any operational issues in a timely manner.

The data submitted was initially made within the required deadline as specified by the permit (28 February 2025). The data was then resubmitted after the deadline. The resubmission was made because the original data was erroneous. This resulted in condition 4.2.2 (b) being breached as the correct data was not submitted within the deadline.

The permit holder had been operating the asset whilst using erroneous data relating to discharges. This had the potential to result in discharges being made without a system which minimised pollution. This has the potential to lead to significant impacts on the environment and is a breach of permit condition 1.1.1.

Actions – please carry out the actions specified above to comply with the permit.
