## 4. Details of our assessment

Bron Afon poultry unit was visited on 27th August 2025.

### Condition 1.1 - General Management

1.1.1 (a) - PAT testing was out of date, and this need to be addressed to minimise the risk of electrical failure

**Action:** Complete PAT testing for the site and provide a certificate to demonstrate this has taken place by **December 1st 2025**

1.1.1 (a) - While risk assessments were present, they had not been reviewed for a few years which is not in line with the operators own "best practice" principle of annual review

1.1.1 (b) - Some staff training was out of date, but staff were booked onto course in the near future

**Action:** Improve control of risk assessment documents and training requirements

### Condition 3.2 - Emissions of substances not controlled by emission limits

3.2.1 - The above ground wastewater/slurry tank only has one valve on the drainage pipe. The Water Resources (Control of Agricultural Pollution) (Wales) Regulations 2021 require two valves on such a pipe. Paragraph 10 of Schedule 6 reads:

*10.—(1) Subject to sub-paragraph (3), if the slurry storage tank or any effluent tank or reception pit is fitted with a drainage pipe there must be two valves in series on the pipe with each valve separated from the other by a minimum distance of 1 metre.*

*(2) Each valve must be capable of shutting off the flow of slurry through the pipe and must be kept shut and locked in that position when not in use.*

*(3) Sub-paragraph (1) does not apply in relation to a slurry storage tank that drains through the pipe into another slurry storage tank if the other tank is of equal or greater capacity or if the tops of the tanks are at the same level.*

**Action:** Install a second valve to the above ground wastewater/slurry tank, as required by The Water Resources (Control of Agricultural Pollution) (Wales) Regulations 2021 - Schedule 6, paragraph 10 by **December 28th 2025**

### Summary

Overall the site was well maintained, with improvements made to the yard concrete since the previous inspection. This is an improvement from the previous inspection.
