4. Details of our assessment

Site report

On Friday 31st October 2025 I arrived at 1-7 Cwrt Griffin, Rudry, Caerphilly CF83 3JQ to

carry out a permit inspection on their Package Treatment Plant. Permit number AN0310001. Discharge into land of secondary treated sewage effluent via an infiltration system. The weather conditions were dry and overcast. My site inspection commenced at 9.35am

Observations

I proceeded to identify the location of the Package Treatment Plant. Please see Fig 1 below.

I lifted the lid on the first chamber (Inlet chamber). There were no signs of solid waste present within this chamber. A slight odour was present. Please see Fig 2 below.

I proceeded to check the third chamber. There were signs of diluted solid waste within this chamber and a slight odour was still present, however the treatment within this chamber

appeared to be working as designed. Please see Fig 3 below.

I attempted to locate the sample/discharge point at National Grid Reference ST 19230 86580. The area at this location was inaccessible due to overgrown vegetation. I followed a footpath that led to the rear of the sample/discharge point and I managed to access the National Grid Reference stipulated by the permit by walking up a steep banking. I was still unable to establish the correct sample/discharge point. There were no odours present or signs of sewage matter at this location. The ground was firm underfoot. Please see Fig 4 below.

This concluded my inspection. I left site at 10.20am.
