3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution or civil sanctions being imposed depending on the circumstances of the offence.

At this time, we do not intend to take any further action.

4. Details of our assessment

NRW Officers attended at Hendre Quarry, Hendre, Mold on 12th November 2025 and carried out a compliance check on the Water Resource Abstraction License held whilst on site.

Both the Operations Manager and Site Manager for the site were present and showed NRW Officers the site and area where the abstraction takes place.

The license states that the source of supply is the Dolfechlas Brook, Gwaelod-Y-Garth, Cardiff although this is incorrect. The source of supply is the Dolfechlas Brook, Hendre, Mold.

The license also provides the point of abstraction as NGR SJ 209 667. This is incorrect and is some distance further downstream of the actual abstraction point which sits beneath a

footbridge at NGR SJ 19839 67668.

The purpose of abstraction is recorded as for sand and gravel washing although this is not applicable to this site as it is a limestone quarry worked for aggregates. The correct purpose of abstraction is for dust suppression on site.

The Site Manager has been informed that an application will be required to vary the license with the above information to ensure compliance is met. This application is required to be submitted by 11th December 2025.

Discussions were also held in relation to the recording and reporting of abstracted water data. Daily meter readings are taken and recorded internally. The returns data is submitted once annually although the license requires monthly submissions of the meter readings.
