4. Details of our assessment

Natural Resources Wales (NRW) Waste Regulation Officer Mark O’GORMAN and Enforcement Officer Chris BURGE attended Rhymney Household Waste Recycling Centre, Lawn Industrial Estate, Rhymney, NP22 5PW at 11.30am on November 24th 2025 to conduct an unplanned site visit and inspection of Permit EPR-QP3899FY. During the visit the weather conditions were dry and clear. At the time of the inspection the site was open to the public and fully operational. NRW officers O’GORMAN and BURGE met with a member of staff who showed NRW officers around the permitted area and explained operations and site procedures.

PERMIT INSPECTION

Site security appeared good with fencing around the site perimeter and the site’s main gate in good condition, also there is CCTV to monitor activity on site.

All waste streams have separate, clearly signed storage containers. The general housekeeping of the site was of a good standard and no waste storage containers were filled beyond capacity. The site’s main yard was free from debris, litter and appeared undamaged. Staff are on hand to assist customers when required and regularly check is user’s waste is compliant and being disposed of correctly. Staff maintain the cleanliness of the site and minimise litter and debris by utilising a clean as you go method during operational hours. NRW officers did not witness any offensive odours or excessive noises during the site inspection or any issues with the sites drainage.
