SeaSTORE research project -Welsh Offshore activities

Briefly describe the low risk band 1 activities you will be carrying out.

For example:

Carrying out minor maintenance on a pier, including installing scaffolding, replacing bolts and decking, then removing scaffolding (construction activity example) Collecting twelve sediment samples from the sea bed (removal activity example) Depositing five marker buoys (deposit activity example) Brushing wind-blown sand back onto the beach where it came from (beach management activity example)

Removal during scientific sampling

- Sample 7 stations (precise location within region TBC) across a fishing gradient sampled with a 1) multi-corer/megacorer (12 undisturbed samples in clear plastic tubes 100mm diameter × 600mm long), 2) SMBA/NIOZ box corer for sediment and 3) fauna and SPI (Sediment Profile Imagery) camera. With multiple replicate samples taken at each station (up to 10 successful box cores and 2 successful mega/multi core deployments). A Day grab will be taken as a back up sampler.
