4. Details of our assessment

Routine inspection of Asset. The weather conditions were showers at the time of the inspection with heavy rain in the days prior.

The site is a Wastewater Treatment Works that processes sewage effluent. The permit (BN0054901) for the site is for the discharge of secondary treated sewage effluent and settled storm sewage to the

Afon Mamog .

Officers were taken through the works from inlet, through the treatment system, and the final effluent sampling station. Officers also checked the discharge point to the Afon Mamog and there did not appear to be any evidence of fungus or rag in the receiving watercourse. However the discharge was seen to be pooling in a small ditch before reaching the main discharge pipe to the receiving watercourse. It was discussed how the channel before the discharge point needs to be cleared to prevent the effluent leaching down the bank before the discharge pipe.

The Process

Effluent enters the site at the inlet before entering into a large septic tank. There is a storm overflow on the inlet where flows spill to the storm tanks. The storm overflow was operating at the time of the inspection. The Storm overflow passes through a simple bar screen before entering into a large above ground storm tank where the solids settle before it is discharged to the environment.

The effluent then gets treated by 2 filter beds. The filter beds appeared to be in good working order with the arms moving freely and there was no excessive growth of vegetation or pooling. The effluent then enters into an above ground final settlement tank before discharging to the environment.

Advisory note

The flow of the discharge from the final effluent pipe at the Final effluent sample chamber was splashing up and out of the chamber. It was discussed that the effluent should not be exiting the chamber and something needs to be put in place to prevent this from occurring.

After the final effluent chamber the discharge was running into an open channel before it reaches the final effluent pipe into the watercourse. This open channel was overgrown and not visible, this channel needs to be cleared and kept open to ensure all the effluent discharges out of the pipe as designed.
