3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

You are non-compliant with your permit.

At this time, we are issuing you with a warning for the non-compliance recorded above. Warnings may influence future enforcement response for continued or further non-compliance.

4. Details of our assessment

This compliance assessment report is being produced following an unannounced inspection of Tanygroes car dismantlers undertaken by Luke Taylor (Senior Waste Regulation Officer) and Murray Pugh (Tackling Waste Crime Officer) of Natural Resources Wales.

It was raining with strong winds during the inspection, and the site was operational.

On arrival the officers met with the site Technically Competent Manager, Stuart Dunseath. The continued competency certificate for Mr Dunseath is in date and covers the activities undertaken at site.

W1A General Management

The site Environment Management System was viewed. This is referred to as the 'Working Plan' due to the age of the permit. A copy is being provided to officers for more detailed review as part of ongoing compliance work.

The de-pollution bay was viewed, with two vehicles undergoing work to remove the necessary fluids and components.

Within the yard area are the waste oil storage tanks, which are contained within a bund. It was raining heavily at the time of the inspection, and there was a small amount of water within the bund, however, there was no evidence of any oil residue. This should be monitored during daily checks and any water removed to ensure the capacity of the bund is not significantly reduced.

W4B Reporting

All required waste returns have been submitted to Natural Resources Wales. The next returns for the year 2025 will be due by 31st January 2026.

W1A General Management - Permit Condition 1.2.2 - Category 3 Breach

Whilst walking the yard area, several vehicles were identified in the top right area of the site. These were not fully de-polluted, with most still having their wheels and tyres, although

missing some parts in some cases, such as lights. Your permit states, under condition 1.2.2. that the storage and treatment operations of waste motor vehicles shall meet the requirements of Schedule 5 of the ELV Regulations and section 4.4.3 of the working plan.



You stated that these had been moved from the impermeable area which has sealed drainage, to create space for a HGV to access the waste scrap metal pile which was being removed from site.

ACTION - Remove any ELV's which have not been fully de-polluted from hardstanding and place on the impermeable surface. Deadline - 31/12/2025

W2D The Site - Permit Condition 3.1.2 - Action only

Permit condition 3.1.2 states that the engineered site containment and drainage systems shall be designed, constructed, inspected, validated and maintained, and shall be fully

documented and recorded, to be fit for purpose and meet the standards specified in Table 3.1 below and in accordance with section 2.1 of the working plan. Table 3.1 'Site Containment and Drainage standards' states:

1. Hardstanding Areas of hardstanding, which include the areas specified in appendix 6 working plan, shall be constructed of granular material (e.g. crushed stone, aggregate, road planings or other similar material) and maintained such that the working surface:
 2. shall remain even
 3. shall not be subject to settlement or differential settlement
 4. shall not be subject to rutting by vehicles even when wet
 5. shall have sufficient durability to allow cleaning for example by scraping
 6. shall remain free of standing water.

Whilst it is accepted that the inspection was conducted following heavy rain, there was evidence of pooling of water on the yard area to the east of the site, with rutting present in the surface of the hardstanding.

ACTION - Continue to monitor the hardstanding areas of the site and remediate as required. No deadline has been set as this is ongoing.
