3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

4. Details of our assessment

On the 11th of December 2025 Natural Resources Wales waste regulation officer carried out an unannounced routine site inspection.

The site is operational; however, at the time of the inspection the gates were locked and no one was present on site. The weather was dry and sunny.

The site is visible from the yard and the findings of the inspection are described below.

The site appeared generally well organised with no amenity issues noted (odour, litter).

W1 General Management

Waste acceptance:

Waste stored on site was segregated into separate piles with some waste stored in large containers.

Waste tyres and mattresses were seen stored on site. Please see photos below.

Whilst both of the afore-mentioned streams are allowed to be accepted on site they seemed not to be included in the site's waste returns as described below in the **Reporting** section of this CAR form.

W1 General Management

Environmental Management System

Following the inspection on the 11th of March 2025 an action was requested for the site owner, or consultant, to provide an updated Environmental Management System (EMS) by the 24th of March 2025.

An updated version of the EMS was received on the 12th of May 2025.

The EMS did not include the site plan which is a vital part of the document.

Since then, three emails have been sent to the owner and the site's consultant requesting the plan to be submitted. To date NRW have not received the plan.

It is deemed that the EMS, in its current form, is insufficient.

This is a breach of condition A:9: Amendments to Working Plan and Supporting Information.

This breach has been assigned a **C3 non-compliance score**.

Action: Please provide a detailed site plan by the **31st of January 2025**.

W4B Reporting – waste returns

A review of the waste returns submissions **Q1 to Q3 2025** for permit EPR- NP3997EE has been completed.

The **Q3 2025 waste returns** are missing the certificate number and Continuing Competency expiry date for the site's Technically Competent Manager.

Waste received

As mentioned in the **General Management** section of this CAR form waste tyres and mattresses were stored on site at the time of inspection.

All quarterly submissions for 2023, 2024 and 2025 have been revised and it appears that only one waste code was stated as received on site, namely 170904, described as Mixed construction & demolition waste.

This doesn't seem to reflect the waste seen on site.

Permit condition I.1.1 requires that “ a record shall be kept of all waste received and all materials (waste and recovered materials) removed from the site (...)

Permit conditions I: 1:2 of your permit specifies that a summary of the information, including nil returns shall be submitted for each quarter of the financial year and shall be submitted within one month of the end of each quarter.

Subsequently a **suspended C3 non-compliance score** has been issued for the breach against the relevant permit conditions.

Action Required: Please revise the waste returns and clarify when the tyres and mattresses were accepted on site.

Please clarify the certificate number and Continuing Competency expiry date for Marco Muia, site's TCM.

Amend the waste returns accordingly and submit to **waste.returns@cyfoethnatriolcymru.gov.uk** no later than the **31st of January 2026**.
