I am writing to provide updated information in relation to the proposed works described below and to ask whether you can confirm that you have no significant concerns?

Please find attached an updated location plan. Since the below correspondence, the following clarifications apply:

- The area of works has increased from *approximately 4 × 4 m* to *approximately 37 × 15 m*.
- The anticipated construction duration has increased from *no more than one week* to *no more than four weeks*.

The works continue to be *patch repair to damaged surface of upper-level ramp of concrete slipway for safety reasons*. All other details previously provided below remain the same.

I am writing to consult with you as part of a Band 1 Marine Licence application on behalf of UWC Atlantic.

Please could you review the below information on the proposed works and confirm that there are no navigational concerns?

Location of works

St Donat's Castle, Llantwit Major, Vale of Glamorgan, Wales. CF61 1WF.
See attached location plan.

Timing and duration of works

Works in daylight hours and at low tide.
Works duration no more than one week.

Brief description of activities

Patch repair to damaged surface of upper-level ramp of concrete slipway for safety reasons
In-situ concrete patch repair to damaged section measuring approximately 4x4m.
Works will take place using land-based plant and no vessels will be used.
Pollution control methods will be in place to prevent spillages or other environmental incidents.

Any potential impacts on the safety of navigation

None. Slipway is private use of UWC Atlantic who are managing the works.
