4. Details of our assessment

This report is in reference to the Abstraction Licence WA/067/0003/007

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) has been raised by Natural Resources Wales (NRW) regulating officers to report on the findings of an unannounced site visit at Inland water (river) known as the Afon Fwy at Dolhendre, Llanuwchllyn, Bala on 2025-10-16, at 1.30pm. The purpose of the visit was to assess compliance of permit/licence number WA/067/0003/003 (Abstraction) and WA/067/0003/007 (Impoundment). The weather was dry and overcast at the time of the visit.

The scheme was abstracting and operational on the day of the compliance visit.

Breaches of permit/licence conditions were identified during the visit, as outlined below:

9.5 – Further Information - (C3) Category 3 breach

9.5 As you were abstracting on the day you have been given a breach for this condition due to the stone being in situ on the residual flow area. As the flow regime as per licence was compromised.

Condition 9.5 (i) states that;

“No Abstraction shall take place unless the rate of flow in the Afon Fwy immediately downstream of the authorised point of abstraction marked Point A, as specified in condition 2.1, is equal to or greater than 12 litres per second and the abstraction shall not cause the flow immediately downstream of said abstraction point to fall below that rate.”

The due date in this report has no relevance, as the obstruction was removed on the day of the visit.

9.7 Outfall screen - (C3) Category 3 breach

The licence states that no abstraction shall take place unless the Licence Holder have installed a fish screen with spacing no greater than 10 millimetres to the outfall structure to prevent the entrapment, entrainment or impingement of fish.

On the compliance visit the outfall did not have a suitable screen. Please install one before 15th April, 2026. Please email me the photos by that date.

See photo 1197 which shows no screen to the outfall pipe.
