### 4. Details of our assessment

LW arrived on site at 2pm. The weather was wet and windy. LW met with Darren Jones(DJ) and Mike Parker (MP)

DJ is the technically competent manager for the site. His COTC is up to date and is due for renewal 22/12/27.

DJ had a query regarding the packaging information in the ADR section of the consignment note for the movement of the two different types of asbestos.

It was established that Packing group II should use the code UN2212 and this is for medium danger asbestos (amphibole, amosite, crocidolite) which requires packaging to withstand a 1-2 metre drop test to prevent release.

Packing group III is for low hazard bonded asbestos (chrysotile/white asbestos, cement sheets and pipes) The minimum packaging should withstand a 0.8 metre drop test. DJ confirmed that all packaging used for the asbestos waste met packing II criteria and the 1-2 metre drop test.

We discussed the EMS which is up to date and is due for renewal in 2028. DJ discussed the issue with waste returns and how time consuming this is. LW spoke about the digital waste tracking system and will forward more details.

LW spoke about the changes in the exemption registration for permitted sites and that this should be in place by June 2026. The site will receive a letter from NRW and there should be a period of grace to add EWC codes to the permit.

LW and DJ went to the permitted area. The site is locked and clearly signposted. The impermeable surface is in good condition. There is a spill kit in place which is fully stocked. The vacuum cleaner for any spills is up to date with the DOP and PAT test recorded on the machine. The next test should be undertaken on or before the 10/05/2026. There are two roll on roll off containers in the facility. One is operational for current waste while the other is in place ready to receive waste when the first container is being transported to the disposal site. These are clearly signed. There is no more than 10 tonnes of asbestos waste stored at any one time in line with the permit conditions.

Air monitoring is undertaken monthly by AnChem and the last three months testing results were forwarded to LW and these were all satisfactory.

Please ensure your EMS has procedures for completing consignment notes and consignee

returns.

The site is a registered premise. CAQ377.
