Can you provide advice on the sediment sample analysis results, in line with OSPAR guidelines, on whether the material can be deemed suitable for dredging and disposal at sea.

In your response, can you please suggest how often sediment must be re-analysed and mitigation measures to address any concerns you may have.

Please provide a quote to review the results within **7 days** this date being 04 November 2019.

Please assess the application over a calendar year to highlight any potential seasonal issues that could arise as a result of the proposal.
