4. Details of our assessment

Maxibrite Limited Licence to Abstract Water - 21/57/31/0043

Site Report

This CAR form has been produced as a response to emails from a Principal Environmental Consultant from Sirius Environmental on behalf of Maxibrite Limited/ its parent company Hargreaves Services.

In an email dated 27/02/2026 it was stated that the main manufacturing operations have ceased on site and the operator is in the process of surrendering the environmental permit held. For this reason it was determined by Natural Resources Wales (NRW) that a site visit was not required.

In an email dated 09/03/2026 it was confirmed that the main operations that the abstraction supported have been decommissioned and the pump had been removed from the lagoon as part of the decommissioning works.

Part 3 Schedule (e) of the licence specifies that the maximum quantity of water that is licensed to be abstracted is 7500m³/year. Returns data from NRW's last visit on 01/08/2018 was reviewed as part of this report. Monthly returns have been uploaded from this date until 31/03/2025 with no non-compliances noted.

As part of the decommissioning work the remaining returns data for 2025-2026 should be uploaded to the NRW returns portal
