4. Details of our assessment

Resources Management U.K Limited (RML) operates Withyhedge Landfill under the provisions of an EPR Permit (MP3330WP). The Site is a non-hazardous landfill which has been constructed in two phases. Phase 1 accepted waste from 1985 until its closure in 2006. Phase 2 is where the current active tipping area is found at the Site; specifically, Cell 10.

Introduction

An announced site inspection was undertaken on the 31st March 2026, to assess the progress of landfilling activities at site.

Odour Assessment

Prior to the site inspection, NRW officers undertook an off-site odour assessment within the local community surrounding the landfill. Assessment locations included Crundale, Poyston, and Spital. Weather conditions at the time were dry and slightly overcast, with a temperature of 11°C and a very light wind from the west-northwest.

No landfill gas or waste odours were detected at any of the locations assessed. Agricultural odours were detected in the majority of the assessment locations.

Operational Area

Landfilling activities were taking place within the valley between Cell 9 and Cell 10. During the inspection of the active tipping area, officers observed no evidence of banned or prohibited waste types.

An intermediate cover layer was present across the uncapped areas of sub Cell 10B. The cover material appeared to be a cohesive, low permeability soil, considered suitable for use as intermediate cover, and is listed within Cell 10's approved waste phasing plan.

Horizontal wells installed in Cell10B were actively extracting landfill gas.

Pest activity across the site, including within the operational area, was minimal.

Cell 9

Permanent gas wells in Cell 9 are now actively extracting landfill gas, operating in conjunction with sacrificial horizontal gas wells installed within the cell.

Landfill Gas Management

Landfill gas engines were operating normally, with one gas flare in use at the time of inspection. No issues were reported with the landfill gas collection system. Recent monitoring indicates hydrogen sulphide (H₂S) concentrations in Cell 9 are approximately 400 ppm, while concentrations in Cell 10 are approximately 3,000 ppm.

Waste Acceptance – Waste Transfer Station (WTS)

NRW officers observed vehicles being unloaded within the Waste Transfer Station and subjected to Level 3 verification testing. The wastes comprised shredded general waste and waste fines, both of which are listed as permitted waste types under the site's environmental permits for both the landfill and the WTS (QP3098FL).

An independent visual inspection of the waste was undertaken by NRW officers, with no evidence of any banned or prohibited wastes observed.

AOB

The operator outlined proposals for landfilling activities over the coming months.

Prior to initiating the landfilling proposal, operator is required to submit an amended waste phasing plan, with sufficient and appropriate evidence for NRW review.
