Assessment Details

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) is a record of Natural Resources Wales' (hereafter NRW) assessment of Drumcastle Limited's (hereafter the operator) Water1 reporting form for Q1 2026 [January to March] against the relevant environmental permit conditions for Reporting, Emissions & Monitoring and Notifications.

Reporting (IR4B)

Note – Following submission and approval of reports to satisfy pre-operational conditions PO2 and PO11, and as detailed in compliance assessment report ref: CAR_NRW0040481, Table S3.3: *Point source emissions to sewer, effluent treatment plant or other transfers off-site– emission limits and monitoring requirements*, will not be enforced at this time. As no monitoring of the emission to sewer is required, no reporting is necessary.
