## **MARINE AND COASTAL ACCESS ACT 2009: PART 4 – MARINE LICENSING**

### **LICENCE TO CARRY OUT REPAIRS TO A TIMBER JETTY AT MARINE TERRACE, ABERYSTWYTH**

#### **LICENCE NUMBER: CML1837**

I am writing to advise you that the Marine Licensing Team, on behalf of the Welsh Ministers, as Licensing Authority, has considered your application, dated 19<sup>th</sup> June 2018 for a Marine Licence under Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, and hereby grant a Marine Licence for you to undertake the above stated works.

Accordingly, please find attached for your review and retention a copy of Marine Licence **CML1837** and its conditions.

#### **Advisory Note**

Marine Licence, **CML1837**, constitutes a statutory consent; therefore the conditions set out herein must be complied with in full and will be binding upon any agent or contractor who undertakes any activity on the project on your behalf.

You are urged to read the conditions of Marine Licence **CML1837** carefully, in particular the need to advise our Marine Enforcement Officers of the commencement of works within **10 days** prior to work starting.

Marine Licence, **CML1837** is solely granted for the work to be undertaken at **Aberystwyth**; however, it does not absolve you from applying for further consents or licences as necessary to enable the full completion of your project.

#### **Advisory note – Ceredigion County Council**

Ceredigion County Council's Local Biodiversity Officer (Alison Heal) has requested that monitoring is carried out on the impacts or lack of, on the starling roost situated on the Aberystwyth Pier during the works on the jetty.

Being within the same council, we would advise that you work with Alison ([Alison.heal@ceredigion.gov.uk](mailto:Alison.heal@ceredigion.gov.uk)) in order to agree the monitoring, as I presume this would be an activity that is undertaken during the works and the onus would be on you, as the applicant, and Alison, to discuss this.

### **Advisory note – Trinity House**

Trinity House has no objections to the proposed application and confirms that the jetty should remain marked. However, if there is a requirement for the beacon to be temporarily removed to facilitate repair works then consideration should be given to the deployment of a marker buoy Green or yellow conical shaped positioned seaward of the works.

### **Advisory note – Maritime and Coastguard Agency**

The site is within port limits and the applicant should gain the approval/agreement of the responsible local navigation authority or the Harbour Authority/Commissioners/Council. They may wish to issue local warnings to alert those navigating in the vicinity to the presence of the works, as deemed necessary.

### **Advisory note – Dyfed Archaeological Trust**

The applicant is advised that should any archaeological material be disturbed or recovered, that they should contact Dyfed Archaeological Trust for further advice in the first instance (Mike Ings, Senior Planning Archaeologist, 01558 825983, email: [m.ings@dyfedarchaeology.org.uk](mailto:m.ings@dyfedarchaeology.org.uk)). Any finds should be reported through the Portable Antiquities Scheme (<https://museum.wales/portable-antiquities-scheme-in-wales-significant-finds/>).

The applicant is advised that if they recover wreck material, it must also be reported to the Receiver of Wreck within 28 days under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995 (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/wreck-and-salvage-law>).

If the works authorised by this Licence are unlikely to be completed by the expiry date, the Licence Holder should apply for a replacement marine licence **at least 4 months** prior to the expiry date of this Licence.

Should you require clarification as to the reasons for the inclusion of any of the conditions attached to the Licence then you must request written notice within 28 days of the receipt of this letter.

### **Rights of appeal**

You have the right of appeal to the Welsh Ministers against this decision. The Appeal must be made in accordance with the Marine Licensing (Appeals Against Licensing Decisions) (Wales) Regulations 2011.

A notice of appeal must be received by the Welsh Ministers within six months beginning with the date of the decision to which the appeal relates.

You must send written notice of appeal including the documents listed below to the Welsh Ministers at the following address:

At the same time, you must send a copy of the notice of appeal to the Natural Resources Body for Wales at the following address:

The notice of appeal must include:

- a) the name, address (including any email address) and telephone number of the appellant and any agent acting for the appellant;
- b) a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- c) a statement as to whether the appellant wishes to have the appeal dealt with by way of written representations, a hearing or an inquiry;
- d) a copy of the decision to which the appeal relates;
- e) a copy of all documents upon which the appellant wishes to rely; and
- f) a list of all the documents, including dates (where any document is dated), specified in bullet points d and e above. :


You may withdraw an appeal by notifying the Welsh Ministers in writing and sending a copy of that notification to the NRW at the address specified above.
