4. Details of our assessment

CARS form generated following site visit to inspect GWERSYLL LLANUWCHLLYN SWIMMING POOL Urdd Gobaith Cymru. Permit Number CM0085301.

The environmental officer from Natural Resources Wales met the deputy director and the maintenance staff from Glan Llyn at 9:45am on the 21/04/2026.

Prior to the site visit it was brought to Natural Resources Wales attention that a sample taken on the 16/04/2026 had failed. The pool water cannot exceed 25 degrees celsius, the sample taken was 27.5 degrees celsius.

Action 1

Why did the pool water exceed 25 degrees when the sample was taken and what action will be taken to prevent any future failures.

Action 2

While looking at the permit there is no designated sample point. Under condition 3 it states that *adequate facilities shall be provided to enable representative samples of the discharge to be safely and conveniently obtained at any time.*

Could Glan Llyn propose where the sample point is to be taken from in the future, the location would need to be taken prior to it mixing with surface waters. This sample location needs to be agreed before Natural Resources Wales visit to take the next sample.

Action 3

It also states in the permit under condition 8: The discharge shall be made on not more

than 4 days per year

And separately under condition 7: The maximum volume of effluent discharged shall not exceed 170 cubic metres per day.

Are you aware that you should only be discharging across 4 days of the year and that on each of those days it should be no more than 170 cubic metres? How do you ensure this is the case?
