4. Details of our assessment

The purpose of this visit was to hand regulation of the site from the current NRW Inspector Brigid Armstead to Richard Taylor who will be the main site contact going forward. This meeting and inspection served as an introduction to the site and an overview of site operations, management and site layout. This physical inspection was limited to a familiarisation exercise and did not look in detail at the technical processes, goods and waste movements, physical infrastructure or drainage systems at this time.

1.0 Site tour

The site was observed to be operating within the permitted site boundary, and the site was clean and tidy with waste streams well catered for. There was no excessive noise or odour from the site and no evidence of vermin or invasive species observed.

The process was walked through with the site representatives with the relevant PE work. Staff were available for questioning and proved to be knowledgeable of the site processes. Water sampling point W1 was viewed and the arrangements for taking samples was questioned and found to be satisfactory. The effluent area was sat on an open grid bund with ample capacity to fulfil permit requirements. Good progress was being made on the tank farm bund improvements. It was noted that the on site check lab holds small amounts of solvents which need to be handled carefully and kept under the correct storage conditions. No issues with this were identified at the time. Maintenance of the chemical holding tanks was under way with the tanks stripped back for Non destructive testing (NDT) to be carried out by a contractor. No issues were identified on site.

2.0 Permit variation

The initial discussion outlined the company's frustrations with the length of time spent in gaining their latest permit variation from NRW in (from August 2024 to August 2025), this severely affected the way the company was able to bid for contracts at the time. The NRW Officers present apologised for the hardship caused and have raised the issue within NRW for examination.

3.0 Permitted Activities

A further issue surrounding the current permit was also discussed. This was the potential to remove the Nitrogen aspect at Schedule 1 of permit EPR/BV5858IW as this may be exempted under RGN2. The removal of this permit condition would reduce the amount of annual subsistence fee to NRW.
