4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) has been issued in response to the submission of the Q1 2026 (January - March) monitoring returns by Dairy Partners (Cymru Wales) Ltd (the operator) for activities at The Creamery, Aberarad, Newcastle Emlyn SA38 9DQ under Environmental Permit EPR-WP3231NB.

Q1 Monitoring Returns 2026

The sampling and analysis results of emissions for the specified parameters and emission points (W1, W2, and W3) for Q1 2026 were submitted by the operator to NRW on 11 February, 03 March and 02 April 2026.

The following documents were submitted for the Q1 2026 monitoring returns:

 2. 01/02/2026 to 28/02/2026

Reporting of emissions to water (other than to sewer) and land

Water1 / 01/01/2026 to 31/01/2026

For the period 1 to 31 January 2026, the submission for emissions to water (W1) provided data for the Maximum daily discharge volume, Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Ammoniacal Nitrogen, Nitrite, Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, Total Aluminium, Temperature, pH, and Chloride.

From the results submitted, all parameters were within the permitted emission limits.

Emission point W2 (which is set to a default closed position) was reported as clear for visible oil and grease. Emission point W3 is blocked up and should not present any discharge risk.

Water1 / 01/02/2026 to 28/02/2026

For the period 1 to 28 February 2026, the submission for emissions to water (W1) provided data for the Maximum daily discharge volume, Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Ammoniacal Nitrogen, Nitrite, Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, Total Aluminium, Temperature, pH, and Chloride.

From the results submitted, all parameters were within the permitted emission limits.

Emission point W2 (which is set to a default closed position) was reported as clear for visible oil and grease. Emission point W3 is blocked up and should not present any discharge risk.

Water1 / 01/03/2026 to 31/03/2026

For the period 1 to 31 March 2026, the submission for emissions to water (W1) provided data for

the Maximum daily discharge volume, Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Ammoniacal Nitrogen, Nitrite, Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, Total Aluminium, Temperature, pH, and Chloride.

From the results submitted, all parameters were within the permitted emission limits.

Emission point W2 (which is set to a default closed position) was reported as clear for visible oil and grease. Emission point W3 is blocked up and should not present any discharge risk.

Compliance Summary

- The monitoring data was sent within the Q1 2026 reporting period, which is compliant with permit condition 4.2.3.
- The monitoring was conducted inside the Q1 2026 monitoring period, which is compliant with permit condition 3.5.1.
- The monitoring returns submitted includes reporting of monitoring carried out in respect of the parameters and emission points specified in table S4.1 of schedule 4, which is compliant with the environmental permit.
- **However, as detailed in compliance report CAR NRW0051581 (Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) audit), it has come to NRW's attention that there were several instances where the operator did not monitor in accordance with the permit, in particular, daily monitoring for Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Total Nitrogen and Total Phosphorus. Failure to monitor these parameters as required by condition 3.5.1 of the permit has already been captured in CAR NRW0051581 and will not be scored again here. A root cause investigation to this monitoring failure has been undertaken by the Operator. NRW will review the response as part of the ETP audit work stream and capture any further associated non-compliance's if required.**

The Operator is reminded to undertake emissions monitoring as required by the permit and to maintain up-to-date records.
