4. Details of our assessment

This was a pre-planned OSM site inspection carried out by Natural Resources Wales Officers Chris Gurney and Kirsty Allwood. The Officers were shown around the site by DCWW Area Supervisor, Process Scientist, and Senior Operative.

Site Description

Llangammach STW is a small sewage treatment works serving a small rural population. The works treats domestic sewage prior to discharge to the Afon Irfon.

Weather conditions

The inspection was carried out under dry conditions with intermittent sunshine, following dry weather the day before.

Inspection

Both officers were given a full site workover from the inlet works through to the final effluent outfall.

Raw sewage enters a primary settlement tank. There were no inlet screens present, however scum boards were present to prevent solids from entering the outfall. Effluent from the primary settlement tank is pumped to a siphon chamber. A copasack was present between the outfall pipe and siphon chamber to collect solids. The copasack appeared to be recently changed and functioning as intended.

The siphon was observed to be operating correctly, passing effluent to the biological filter bed. The filter bed distributor arms were observed to be moving freely, with effluent being evenly distributed across the media. There was some localised ponding of effluent on the surface of the filter bed.

Action: Assess the filter bed media and carry out necessary maintenance to prevent ponding of effluent

Effluent from the biological filter flows to a final settlement tank. Retention boards were present to prevent accumulated humus solids from entering the outfall. The effluent within the final settlement tank appeared foamy, however DCWW Process Scientist advised this was due to turbulent created by the drop between the outfall pipe and effluent surface.

The sample point was clearly marked and accessible. No discolouration or sewage fungus was

observed within the sample point chamber. The discharge point to the River Irfon was inspected. There was evidence of bank erosion adjacent to the outfall, including the presence of a large piece of concrete within the channel, which appeared to be contributing to the localised erosion. A small amount of sewage fungus was observed on the exposed rocks within the vicinity of the discharge. No sewage fungus was observed within the waterbody itself at the time of inspection.

The wastewater treatment works appeared to be operating as intended at the time of inspection.
