4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report is in relation to the Discharges to Water OMA (Operating Monitoring Assessment) Audit dated 7th May 2026.

Pilgrim Lamb UK Ltd has an appropriate and well structured system in place to ensure that the requirements for water monitoring as set out in their permit conditions are met and achieved.

There is an EMS in place which has dedicated policies and procedures for the monitoring requirements of the permit, as well as a well defined organisational structure for the monitoring programme which includes contingencies where required.

All personnel involved in the production of valid and correct environmental data are properly trained and resourced. Training records are kept up to date.

The compliance samples are undertaken by an external laboratory (ALS) which is MCERTS accredited and in line with the requirements of the permit.

In house daily analysis of pH and ammonia appear to be carried out in accordance with the relevant methods and standards. Calibration and maintenance of the equipment used was adequate and traceable through the evidence provided.

For the continuous monitoring systems (CEMS) on site (flow meter) this is MCERTS accredited and there are adequate provisions for monitoring and location suitability. The meter is calibrated and audited annually. The measurement methods and standards are appropriate, and calibration and maintenance are carried out routinely.

The site achieved an overall score of 87%

The absence of adequate evidence for the monitoring records and use of monitoring data (as identified in OMA Sect 1D of both the 2021 and 2026 OMA's) is in breach of permit condition 1.1.1 and attracts a non-compliance score (C4 - 0.1).
