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# 1. Executive summary

## 1.1. Application summary

The operator is applying for a low risk full surrender of their environmental permit, citing that they have never exceeded 40,000 birds at the site. This decision has been approved by the site officer. The site will still be in operation but will be operating under the threshold of 40,000 birds and therefore will not require a permit under Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016.

## 1.2. Our decision

We have decided to accept the surrender of the permit for Cloddiau Poultry Unit operated by Mr Daniel Jerman, as the site was never developed to the permitted capacity of 56,800 birds. The site currently has a capacity for 24,000 birds which is under the permitting threshold.

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid any pollution risk and to return the site to a satisfactory state.

We consider in reaching that decision we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements.

# 2. Receipt of the application

The application was received on 10/12/2025. In order for us to be able to consider the application duly made, we needed more information. We requested the following:

- Site Condition Report

A letter requesting this information was sent to the applicant on 22/05/2026. Upon receipt of this information, on 08/06/2026, we were able to consider the application duly made. This means we considered it was in the correct form and contained sufficient information for us to begin our determination, but not that it necessarily contained all the information we would need to complete that determination.

### 3. Legislation

The surrender will be granted, under Regulation 25 of the EPR. The Environmental Permitting regime is a legal vehicle which delivers most of the relevant legal requirements for activities falling within its scope. In particular, the regulated facility is:

- an *installation* as described by the IED;
- subject to aspects of the Well-Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 and the Environment (Wales) Act 2016 which also have to be addressed.

We address the legal requirements directly where relevant in the body of this document. NRW is satisfied that the decision on this application is consistent with its general purpose of pursuing the sustainable management of natural resources (SMNR) in relation to Wales and applying the principles of SMNR. In particular, NRW acknowledges that it is a principle of sustainable management to take action to prevent significant damage to ecosystems. We consider that, in granting the surrender a high level of protection will be delivered for the environment and human health. NRW is satisfied that this decision is compatible with its general purpose of pursuing the sustainable management of natural resources in relation to Wales and applying the principles of sustainable management of natural resources

### 4. The Site

#### 4.1. Pollution risk

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid a pollution risk resulting from the operation of the regulated facility.

#### 4.2. Satisfactory state

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to return the site of the regulated facility to a satisfactory state.

In coming to this decision, we have had regard to the state of the site before the facility was put into operation.
