Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

You are non-compliant with your permit.

At this time, we are issuing you with a warning for the non-compliance recorded above. Warnings may influence future enforcement response for continued or further non-compliance.

This statement does not stop us from taking additional enforcement action if further relevant information comes to light or offences continue.

4. Details of our assessment

A review of the 2025 annual waste return submitted for permit PP3092FN has been undertaken. This review has identified non-compliance in relation to the permit conditions outlined below.

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W1A - General Management

As stated in permit condition 1.1.1.(a), *"the activities shall be managed and operated by sufficient persons who are competent in the respect of the responsibilities to be undertaken by them in connection with the operation of the activities"*.

On 8 May 2026, NRW contacted S & R Metals by telephone and email to confirm receipt of the 2025 annual waste return. The return was subsequently rejected as it had been submitted using an outdated template that is no longer in use, as it does not reflect current regulatory requirements, including the recording of the site's Technically Competent Manager (TCM) details.

As a result, NRW Waste Regulation Officers undertook a review of the site's most recent returns and the requirements relating to Technical Competent Manager (TCM) provision. The 2025 return has been signed by Rosalind Jones, however, the TCM section has been left incomplete and does not confirm who is acting as the designated TCM for the site.

A check with WAMITAB indicates that Rosalind Jones last completed the required continuing competence assessment on 12 September 2016. Certification for continuing competence is valid for two years from the date of issue either from the initial qualification or the most recent continuing competence assessment for the relevant activity. As such, there is currently no evidence that a suitably competent and certified TCM is in place for the permitted activities at the site.

Action: *Provide NRW with a copy of the site's current TCM's most up-to-date continuing competence certificate by no later than the 6 July 2026.*

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W4A - Records

As stated in permit condition 4.1.1(a), "All records required to me made by this licence shall be legible".

As stated in the correspondence provided by NRW's Waste Returns Team, the template used to submit your annual waste return is outdated and no longer in use. It does not reflect current regulatory requirements and legislation. Due to the absence of required information within this outdated template, the submitted waste return is not considered to be compliant with record-keeping requirements, constituting a breach of this permit condition.

Please note that the most up to date version of the waste return template (V9 for 2026) is attached to this report in both Welsh and English. This template should be used for all future submissions unless otherwise advised by NRW.

Action: S & R Metals must complete their waste returns using the correct and most up-to-date template and resubmit it to waste.returns@cyfoethnaturiolcymru.gov.uk by the specified date.

A CCS Category 4 score has been applied in relation to this non-compliance against permit condition 4.1.1 (Records), as the use of an outdated template has resulted in an incomplete and non-compliant waste return submission.
