

Natural Resources Wales permitting decisions

Bespoke permit

We have decided to grant the permit for Pen Y Pentre Caravan Park operated by Pen Y Pentre Caravan Park Ltd

The application number is PAN-003608

The permit number is EPR/BB3098ZM

The permit regulates the discharge of a maximum of 7 cubic metres per day of primary treated sewage effluent to groundwater via an infiltration system. The system serves a Caravan Park with 35 static caravans. The system has been in situ since 1977 and the effluent is domestic in nature.

We consider in reaching that decision we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements and that the permit will ensure that the appropriate level of environmental protection is provided.

Purpose of this document

- shows how all relevant factors have been taken into account
- justifies the specific conditions in the permit other than those in our generic permit template.
