3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

At this time, we do not intend to take any further action.

This statement does not stop us from taking additional enforcement action if further relevant information comes to light or offences continue.

4. Details of our assessment

This was an unannounced site inspection following a number of Wales Incident Reports (WIRS) that NRW has received about odour from the site.

Olfactory monitoring was conducted prior to the site visit at the following locations:

Llanidiloes town centre

Bryn Du Road

Tylwch

Unnamed road to the rear of the site

A slight burnt odour (2/6) was detected at the crossroads to the south east of the site. This was not detected on site during the duration of our visit.

The site manager and environmental technician were present on site and accompanied us for the duration of our visit.

No engineering works were ongoing at the time of our visit but the site manager stated they were hoping to re-start the permanent capping works towards the end of the month.

We requested an update of what areas of the landfill had been capped and what areas remained to be capped. The site manager could only provide a rough estimation.

Action 1

Confirm in writing the date when the permanent capping works will re-commence and reasonable timescales for the completion of the permanent capping and restoration works at the site.

Action 2

Provide NRW with an updated capping plan that quantifies which areas of the site are

currently capped, uncapped and fully restored.

The site provided updates about the leachate treatment lagoon which is now not being fully utilised and the aerators were turned off during our visit. Leachate is now being mainly tankered off-site for disposal.

Site confirmed they were planning on emptying the middle surface water lagoon on site to reduce suspended solids and ammonia into the P1 discharge point and that they are trialling the use of geotextile membrane in the ditches leading to P2 discharge point to reduce suspended solids.

There was a strong odour of landfill gas on site during the inspection in the South West corner of the site.

The toes of Phase 9 D&E were inspected and the liquid that had been previously observed was not present during this visit.

The MRF concreted area was viewed and there was a small flow of what appeared to be water across the surface and into the sump. The operator stated that both of these flows had been tested and it was clean water discharging from the haul road and the composting pad.

Action 3

Provide the test results of the water sampled from both the haul road and the composting pad.

The operator has now removed all waste tyres from the site which is a very positive achievement.
