Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

4. Details of our assessment

This was a routine review of data undertaken by Malcolm Dines (Waste Regulation Officer) to assess compliance with the actions set out in Compliance Report CAR_NRW0051590, dated 22/04/2026.

Permit Breaches

W1A - Category 3; Permit Rule 1.1.1(a) - Failure to comply with compliance actions

You have been given this category 3 breach of Rule 1.1.1(a) because you failed to comply with the actions set out in Compliance Report CAR_NRW0051590, dated 22/04/2026. I received an email dated 05/06/2026 stating that the information required by the actions set out in that report would be submitted the following week, which would have been by 14 June 2026 at the latest.

Rule 1.1.1(a) requires you to operate in accordance with a written Management System that identifies and minimises risks of pollution, so far as is reasonably practicable, including those risks arising from, amongst other requirements, non-conformances.

As you have failed to comply with the compliance actions, this means either your Management System is inadequate, or you are not complying with your Management System.

ACTION: Comply with actions specified on compliance reports **with immediate effect**

ACTION: Submit the version of your Environmental Management System in use on 22 April 2026, the date compliance report CAR_NRW0051590 was issued **by 13 September 2026**

ACTION: Submit the current version of your Environmental Management System in use on the date of issue of this compliance report **by 13 September 2026**

W4A - Records - Category 3; Permit Rule 2.1.6 - Failure to Submit Spreading Records

You have been given this Category 3 breach under Rule 2.1.6 because you have failed to submit spreading records for 2025 containing sufficient information to assess your spreading activities against approved deployment PAN-25617, as required by CAR_NRW0051590 dated 22/04/2026.

It is reasonably foreseeable that the failure to make and submit accurate records of the material you have spread may result in a minor pollution of the environment as you are not able to demonstrate that you have complied with the conditions of your deployment and permit, both of which are written to be environmentally protective.

ACTION: Submit revised spreading records for all deployment activities in 2025, that contain the following information **by 13 September 2026**:

- Date of spreading (day/month/year)
- Field ref
- Type of waste spread
- Quantity of waste spread
- Source of waste
- Weather conditions

W4B - Reporting - Category 3; Permit Condition 4.2.2 - Incorrect Waste Returns

You have been given this Category 3 breach under the above permit condition because the quarterly waste returns you have submitted for 2025 are all "nil" returns, but the spreading records you have submitted for 2025 show that you have spread waste during 2025 and so this material must be reported on the wastes received section of the waste returns.

Additionally, the LDP1 Form you submitted in your application for deployment PAN-032366 includes details of waste you spread to the land you applied to spread under PAN-032366. The LDP1 Form was dated 01 April 2026 and so the previous 12 months land use applies to material spread from 2 April 2025 until 1 April 2026. This spreading has not been

recorded on your waste returns.

It is reasonably foreseeable that the failure to make and submit accurate records of the material you have spread may result in a minor pollution of the environment as you are not able to demonstrate that you have complied with the conditions of your deployment and permit, both of which are written to be environmentally protective.

ACTION: Submit revised waste returns for 2025 that report the wastes received for all landspreading activities carried out in 2025 **by 13 September 2026**.

W1A - General Management - Action Only; Permit Rule 1.1.1(a) - Waste Transfer Notes

On compliance report CAR_NRW0051590 dated 22/04/2026 you were required to submit copies of the Waste Transfer Notes for ALL wastes accepted to be spread under this permit. You failed to comply with this action.
