LICENCE TO CARRY OUT REGIONAL MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES, ROYAL NATIONAL LIFEBOAT INSTITUTE, SOUTH WEST DIVISION

I am pleased to advise you that the Marine Licensing Team within Natural Resources Wales, on behalf of the Welsh Ministers, as Licensing Authority, has considered the email dated **28 August 2019** from Lara Moore requesting a change to a Marine Licence under Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, and hereby grant the Marine Licence for you to undertake the above stated works.

Accordingly, please find attached for your review and retention a copy of Marine Licence **CML1820v1** and its conditions. Please note that Marine Licence **CML1820v1** supersedes Marine Licence **CML1820** in its entirety.

Condition number 8.9 has been changed to read as follows:

The Licence Holder must submit a Site Specific Beach Management Method Statement to NRW acting on behalf of the Licensing Authority for written approval at least 6 weeks prior to commencement of any beach management activity which involves the importation of beach material at site 9 (Horton and Port Eynon Lifeboat Station) from outside the site co-ordinates. No works may be undertaken prior to written agreement from NRW acting on behalf of the Licensing Authority.

Advisory Note

Marine Licence, **CML1820v1**, constitutes a statutory consent; therefore the conditions set out herein must be complied with in full and will be binding upon any agent or contractor who undertakes any activity on the project on your behalf.

Marine Licence, **CML1820v1** is solely granted for the work to be undertaken with the area specified in the Licence; however, it does not absolve you from applying for further consents or licences as necessary to enable the full completion of your project.

If the works authorised by this Licence are unlikely to be completed by the expiry date, the Licence Holder should apply for a replacement marine licence **at least 4 months** prior to the expiry date of this Licence.

Should you require clarification as to the reasons for the inclusion of any of the conditions attached to the Licence then you must request written notice within 28 days of the receipt of this letter.

Finally, once again, please ensure you have read and understood Marine Licence **CML1820v1**. Should you have any queries with regards to your Marine Licence then please do not hesitate to contact the Marine Licensing Team.
