This was a routine unannounced site inspection by Natural Resources Wales (NRW) officer Alastair Wilson (Environment Officer).

Throughout the inspection weather conditions were cool with light rain. No breaches were observed during the inspection.

Upon arrival the officer introduced themselves the site manager Stuart Dunseath, who accompanied the officer during the inspection. Stuart has continued technical competence certification until March 2020.

A walk around of the permitted area was carried out. Hardstanding areas were in reasonable condition with a few small puddles due to the recent heavy rain.



Impermeable surfaces (which are continuous from the public highway) were in good condition and the highway outside the site was clean. The drain in front of the depollution bay contained water (it was raining) and was about to be cleaned/rodded out as it was only draining slowly. Other drains through the site were working adequately, and with the current heavy rains it is important to keep them clear of obstructions.

The bund below the waste fuel tank had a small amount of water in it, but there were no signs of any oil on the water.



Waste segregation and storage appeared to be good.

On the last inspection there had been some issues with the tyre recycling company being unreliable, however Mr Dunseath said they were now using a new company that collected tyres by the arctic lorry load, and they were much more reliable, and cost effective.



A selection of depolluted vehicles were checked for fluids, all those checked were found to be free of liquids. Many of the vehicles had engines/gearboxes removed completely.

In the office the site diary was kept up to date with relevant details of attendance, checks, and any incidents.

The sign at the entrance to the site has out of date phone numbers and refers to the Environment Agency rather than Natural Resources Wales.



Please update your sign to the latest details as stated in the document “How to comply with your environmental permit” on page 36, I have included the text below, please note that I have removed one of the telephone numbers as this is not used any more.

Display a notice at or near the site entrance telling the public about the nature of the site and who they can contact for further information or who to notify if they have a concern. It needs to be easily readable from outside the site in daylight hours and must include:
