The main purpose of Veolia Energy & Services UK at the Pontypridd Installation is to serve the PB Leiners gelatin plant with steam. Dry saturate steam is produced by three gas fired boilers with an aggregated thermal input of no more than 20 MWth. The activity is classified as a 'directly associated activity' as defined in schedule 1, paragraph 1(2) EPR and therefore requires regulating as part of an installation as defined in Schedule 1, paragraph 1(1) EPR.

Within this permit is the requirement to undertake and report monitoring of a number of substances on an annual basis. This is repeated below:

4.2.2 *A report or reports on the performance of the activities over the previous year shall be submitted to Natural Resources Wales by 31 January (or other date agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales) each year. The report(s) shall include as a minimum:*

- (a) a review of the results of the monitoring and assessment carried out in accordance with the permit including an interpretive review of that data;*
- (b) The annual production /treatment data set out in schedule 4 table S4.2; and*
- (c) The performance parameters set out in schedule 4 table S4.3 using the forms specified in table S4.4 of that schedule.*

A review of the monitoring results conducted by Veolia was received on the 3rd of March. According to Veolia there was no worsening of the performance over previous years and they do not anticipate any decline in this performance in the future. Annual production of steam reduced by 1.5% on the previous year, However PB Leiners increased their Gelatine production during this year. Energy Usage in 2019 was 70,124MWh of Natural Gas which resulted in an overall boilerhouse efficiency for the year of 82%, in line with the expectations for the type and condition of the installed plant.

Emission values for the three boilers were recorded and are within the scope of the Medium Combustion Plant Directive (MCPD) limits. Although there are no current set limits within the permit It's prudent to operate the boilers within the MCPD limits since these more stringent limits will come into effect in 2025.

Action:

Please can Veolia provide a copy of the monitoring report so that NRW can get a better understanding how the emissions results were obtained.

Site are to be reminded that the final date for submitting monitoring results is the 31st January. I am not going to issue a non-compliance this time. However, site must ensure that future results are submitted on time as a priority.
