MARINE AND COASTAL ACCESS ACT 2009: PART 4 – MARINE LICENSING

LICENCE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW RETAINING WALL

I am pleased to advise you that the Marine Licensing Team within Natural Resources Wales, on behalf of the Welsh Ministers, as Licensing Authority, has considered **Associated British Ports** email dated **10 February 2020** requesting an extension to a Marine Licence under Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, and hereby grant the Marine Licence for you to undertake the above stated works.

Accordingly, please find attached for your review and retention a copy of Marine Licence **CML1858v1** and its conditions. Please note that Marine Licence **CML1858v1** supersedes Marine Licence **CML1858** in its entirety.

Licence has been varied to change the methodology of the project. This includes the dredge amount which has been reduced from 1800m³ to 720m³.

Scour protection is also not necessary anymore as there is no abrupt change in the direction of the pier.

In addition, the new retaining wall will comprise of a double wall of steel sheet-piles instead of a combination pile wall.

Conditions 9.11 and 9.12 have also been removed as no longer necessary due to methodology changes.

Please note the contact details for Marine Enforcement has been updated on the licence.

Advisory Note

Marine Licence, **CML1858v1**, constitutes a statutory consent; therefore, the conditions set out herein must be complied with in full and will be binding upon any agent or contractor who undertakes any activity on the project on your behalf.

Marine Licence, **CML1858v1** is solely granted for the work to be undertaken with the area specified in the Licence; however, it does not absolve you from applying for further consents or licences as necessary to enable the full completion of your project.

If the works authorised by this Licence are unlikely to be completed by the expiry date, the Licence Holder should apply for a replacement marine licence **at least 4 months** prior to the expiry date of this Licence.

Should you require clarification as to the reasons for the inclusion of any of the conditions attached to the Licence then you must request written notice within 28 days of the receipt of this letter.

Finally, once again, please ensure you have read and understood Marine Licence **CML1858v1**. Should you have any queries with regards to your Marine Licence then please do not hesitate to contact the Marine Licensing Team.

The UK left the EU on 31 January 2020 and has entered a transition period until the 31 December 2020. The legal obligations relating to compliance with environmental permits and legislation continue to apply.
