Introduction

This Compliance Assessment Report is a follow up to report NRW_0036349. Please refer that that report for more information.

In the first report I asked for more information so that I could determine if a non-compliance had occurred. I also indicated which permit conditions had potentially been breached. They were:

- Condition 3.1 Emissions to water. Condition 3.1.1 states that the limits given in Schedule 3 Table s3.1 shall not be exceeded. The limit for visible oil or grease is described as 'No significant trace present so far as is reasonably practicable'.
- Condition 4.3 Notifications. Condition 4.3.1(a) states that Natural Resources Wales shall be notified as soon as reasonably practicable following detection, within the site of the regulated facility of: (b) any breach of a limit specified in schedule 3 table S3.1 including individual exceedances of limits which are covered by condition 3.1.2.

Compliance Assessment, Actions and Recommendations

With respect to Condition 3.1.1, the information available to me raises some doubt as to whether the level of oil pollution was significant enough to have been recorded as a breach of the limit. I have, therefore, decided that the discharge is compliant with Condition 3.1.1 because I believe that the amount of oil present was not significant enough to be reportable as a breach of the permit limits.

With respect to Condition 4.3.1(a), given that DCWW had recorded a breach NRW should have been informed as soon as reasonably practicable. I have recorded this as a breach of this permit condition. My understanding is that it was not reported because the mechanism for reporting breaches is via the OSM reporting system which only acts on numeric breaches.

ACTION: PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU HAVE THE SYSTEMS IN PLACE TO REPORT EXCEEDANCES OF OIL OR GREASE TO NRW.

RECOMMENDATION: WHEN TRACES OF OIL OR GREASE ARE DETECTED IN THE FINAL EFFLUENT DISCHARGE, BUT THEY ARE NOT SIGNIFICANT ENOUGH TO BE RECORDED AS A BREACH OR THEY ARE DETECTED AT TIMES OTHER THAN OSM SAMPLING, THE EVENT SHOULD BE REPORTED TO NRW AS A POLLUTION INCIDENT.

Enforcement

Under the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016, Section 38 (2), it is an offence for a person to fail to comply with or to contravene an environmental permit condition. My enforcement response to this non-compliance is to provide the advice and guidance given in

this Compliance Assessment Report with the aim of assisting you to come back into compliance.
