One completed hard copy of the application and supporting documents will always be required. Additional copies are required for consultation purposes.

 - For applications larger than 10MB **16** additional copies in CD/DVD format will be required
 - When applications and supporting documents are hard copy only **16** copies will be required.

- Please submit marine licence applications including this form and all supporting documents **at least 4 months before the licence is required.**

Some projects may raise matters that require a significantly longer time for consideration.

These are most likely to be:

- Projects that fall **within** The Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2007 – as amended requiring an Environmental Statement
- Large scale projects with substantial volumes of material being deposited or excavated
- Works requiring an Appropriate Assessment to be conducted under The Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017
- Please note that an application will not be considered to be complete until sediment sampling and analysis has been undertaken. Please allow an additional **2 months** for sampling plan details and all relevant information to be submitted should sampling analysis be required.
- Information should be provided about the anticipated **duration of the entire project** in respect of works below/seaward of Mean High Water Spring (MHWS). Where appropriate, planned phasing of the work for which consent is sought must be detailed. For projects lasting more than one calendar year, planned phasing details must be given for each 12 month period.

A licence fee is payable in respect of an application. Details of fees can be found on our web pages.

Please note applications will not be processed without the correct relevant fee or invoicing details.

How your application will be processed by the MLT:

- If the application is not complete, further information will be request and need to be provided before the application can be considered as complete
- Our **4 months** service level for determining non-EIA applications will begin from the date the **completed** application, including sampling results, is received (*Please note some projects may take significantly longer than 4 months to determine due to their nature*)
- EIA projects may take significantly longer due to their scale and complexity. Therefore we encourage early engagement with the MLT
- Your application and supporting documents will be sent to for an initial consultation period of 28 days (*42 days for EIA projects*)
- For the majority of projects, a public notice must be advertised. Public consultation will be 28 days (*49 days for EIA projects*). For EIA projects a second public notice will be required. The MLT will advise on how this should be done.

Holyhead Port Expansion

1(b). Please provide a brief description of the proposed project, including location

Holyhead Port is located on Holy Island (Ynys Gybi) on the western side of the Isle of Anglesey, North Wales. The proposed scheme comprises the following dredging activities:

- reclamation of two intertidal/subtidal areas (the Salt Island Expansion and the Pelham Patch Development);
- dredging of an approach channel to the new berths at 10m bCD;
- dredging of the new berth at Pelham Patch;
- dredging at the base of quay walls on Salt Island to accommodate the installation of scour protection;
- possible additional dredging for installation of caissons as the new quay walls (depending on methodology selection).

The current bed levels within the dredge area range from approximately 3m bCD to 10m bCD. The proposed approach channel would be dredged to a target depth of 10m bCD. A relatively small amount of material would require dredging from the berth at Pelham Patch to reach a target depth of 5m bCD.

The capital dredge would remove approximately 2.05 Million m³ (Mm³) of material, the majority of which would arise from the proposed approach channel and a smaller amount from the reclamation areas. All dredged material is proposed to be disposed of immediately at the licenced Holyhead North disposal site (IS043). The material required (approximately 1,010,000m³) for reclamation would be sourced from a licensed marine aggregate site.

It is estimated that the proposed works will take two years to complete, starting in Q2 2021.

The method statement for the dredging and disposal requirements is provided in full in **Section 3.2.4** and **3.2.5** of the accompanying ES, and is summarised below.

The maximum volume of material to be dredged during the proposed project is 2,015,354m³. This takes into account the installation of caisson walls that would sit in dredged pockets. Should caisson walls not be installed then the total volume of material to be dredged is likely to be c. 120,000m³ less. The dredging operation consists of the following (based upon the piled quay wall option):

- Capital dredge of the approach channel to 10m below Chart Datum (bCD) (1.835million m³)
- Capital dredge in front of the new quay wall at Pelham Patch Development to 5.5m bCD (14,550m³)
- Dredging within Salt Island Expansion (37,750m³) and Pelham Patch Development (3,950m³) reclamation areas to remove soft clay.
- Capital dredge in front of the proposed main quay wall at Salt Island Expansion for installation of scour protection (9,275m³)

Dredged material is made up of gravel and sands, firm clay, soft clay and rock. It is anticipated that dredging methods to be employed are trailer suction hopper dredging (TSHD) for the softer soils and back hoe excavation to remove firm clay and rock. Rock-breaking methodology may be employed to fracture bedrock. Cutter suction dredging (CSD) has been considered, however the use of this method would limit the re-use of the dredged material in the reclamation areas. The material dredged by the TSHD will be transported within its integral hopper with a capacity of approximately 5,000m³. The material dredged by the backhoe dredger will be transported by a separate hopper barge with an approximate capacity of 2,000m³.

All dredged material will be disposed at the Holyhead North disposal site (IS043).

An updated dredging programme is provided in **Figure 2.11** of the ES Addendum to reflect required changes to the dredging and disposal activities
