4. Details of our assessment

This Compliance Assessment Report follows a review of the Quarter 1 (January – March 2020) and Quarter 2 (April - June 2020) emissions monitoring reports for environmental permit WP3836ZF – Wrexham Clinical Waste Incinerator.

Requirements: Condition 4.1.2.4 requires that a report on emissions over the previous quarter shall be submitted within 28 days of the end of the reporting period.

Findings: The Emissions reports for January - March 2020 were submitted on time. The Emissions reports for April – June 2020 were submitted on 21.08.2020. **A score of CCS4, against criteria G4 - Reporting and notification, has been issued.**

Action: Review procedures for reporting to NRW to ensure they reflect the permit requirements.

Bottom Ash monitoring

Ash composition for both Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 shows composition below the 3% TOC limit, however the reading for the last 4 months Mar – Jun has been consistently 0.1% which does not follow historical trends.

Action: Please clarify these results are a true reflection of TOC within the ash and report back to NRW by 31.10.2020.

Bi- annual Monitoring January - June 2019

Requirements: Condition 2.2.1.3 requires that emissions to air will not exceed levels set out in Table 2.2.2.

Findings: Bi- annual monitoring from emission point A1 was undertaken in February. A breach of mercury was recorded - 0.107mg/m³ against a limit of 0.05mg/m³. All other results were below permitted ELV's. Part A received 01.04.2020, Part B 26.06.2020. **A score of CCS3 against criteria E1 has been issued for this breach.**

Action: Review analysis after scheduled sampling to see if breach was an anomaly and report back to NRW by 31.10.2020.

CEMS Data

Q1 2020 (January - March 2020) – missing data 21-25 March 2020.

Q2 2020 (April – June 2020) missing data 4-7, 11, 12, 24-29 May, 26-30 June.

The operator has stated that where data is missing the plant was not operational.

There was a CO spike on 29 January 2020, this was below the permit ELVs.

On 01 June 2020 a HCl level of 10.3mg/m³ against an ELV of 10 mg/m³ was recorded. On 02 June 2020 the daily average of CO was 51.6mg/m³ against an ELV of 50mg/m³. Both these results are within the confidence limits of the permit.

Operations

A notification was received in accordance with Condition 5.1.1.6 that the Emergency Relief Vent was opened for 2 hours and 50 minutes on 29th January 2020 due to Power cut at Wrexham Industrial estate.
