4. Details of our assessment

During the period of dry weather in 2020, NRW did not carry out compliance inspections on

this site due to Covid 19 restrictions. Alternatively, NRW contacted Hafren Dyfrdwy, requesting data to check compliance and asking specific questions at certain sites. Hafren Dyfrdwy provided a report for this abstraction by email on 06/08/2020, which was followed by further information on 18/08/2020.

The totaliser figure provided is for 02/08, and abstracted quantities below are for that day and the previous 7 days, provided by Hafren Dyfrdwy. These are well within the licensed daily maximum quantity of 11365.225.

The Licence refers to the Wrexham Waterworks Acts 1874 and 1902. The Acts require that 114m³ (1.32 l/s) from Cae Llwyd and 182m³ (2.1 l/s) per day from Ty Mawr are caused to flow freely down the Pentrebychan Brook. That they are to lay down and maintain all necessary gauges.

To the knowledge of NRW and Hafren Dyfrdwy there have never been any gauges in place. There have previously been blockages in the small orifice that is currently thought to deliver the compensation flow. A meeting and sit visit were carried out in 2019 to look at the feasibility of installing a means of gauging. HD suggested that provision for measurement could be included in reservoir safety work. The following information was provided on 18/08/20:

We are currently working with our Reservoir Safety team and Design team to work out the logistics of installing a new v-notch weir at Ty Mawr to replace the current arrangement for measuring the compensation flow. There is dam safety improvement works planned at Ty Mawr for later in the year and it is hoped that the weir construction can be included in this schedule. We will provide copies of the design and a detailed schedule of works once finalised.

There is still no facility for the measurement of compensation water, however NRW are aware that HD plan to resolve this non-compliance shortly. Please provide NRW with copies of design and schedule of works as stated above prior to work taking place. Please ensure that measurement facility is installed and operational by 31/03/2021.
