4. Details of our assessment

The purpose of this Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) is to record Natural Resources Wales' (hereafter *NRW*) assessment against Resources Management UK Limited's (hereafter *RML*) **Q3** [2020] monitoring and reporting requirements. NRW's assessment of RML's monitoring returns data is outside the scope of this CAR and any non-compliance arising from an exceedance of a permitted emission limit will be recorded in a separate CAR.

Condition 4.2.3 of the environmental permit states:

Within 28 days of the end of the reporting period the operator shall, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Agency (sic), submit reports of the monitoring and assessment carried out in accordance with the conditions of this permit, as follows:

- (a) in respect of the parameters and emission points specified in schedule 5 table S5.1;*
- (b) for the reporting periods specified in schedule 5 table S5.1 and using the forms specified in schedule 5 table S5.4; and*
- (c) giving the information from such results and assessments as may be required by the forms specified in those tables.*

The monitoring returns were submitted via email on 11 November 2020

The monitoring returns submission was made outside the reporting window which represents **non-compliance** with the environmental permit.

On 29 October 2020, RML contacted NRW via email advising that they were still awaiting the results of laboratory analysis of some of their monitoring samples and that this delay was caused by complications arising from the coronavirus pandemic. RML requested an extension to the deadline for submission of its Q3 monitoring returns.

We recognise that the coronavirus pandemic and the restrictions imposed to control its spread has had far reaching effects, including on laboratory analytical throughput. This recognition extends to our approach to permit

breaches which arise from an operator's inability to meet certain monitoring standards because of these restrictions. This approach has been formalised via the application of the Regulatory Decision ref. RBB C19 001. Details of Regulatory Decision ref. RBB C19 001 may be found on our website here:

As a result of this non-compliance a CCS Score C4 has been recorded against compliance sub-criteria (G)(1).

HOWEVER, the above CCS Score is suspended as per Regulatory Decision ref. RBB C19 001.

We remind the operator that any future requests for extensions to monitoring returns submission deadlines must be done in advance of the closing of the reporting window. Any future late submissions, whatever the justification, will attract non-compliance scores, unless previously agreed with the regulator. Note also that, in order for the regulator to agree an extension, we may require further information to support our decision and therefore the operator should make contact with us at their earliest opportunity.

The monitoring returns submitted include reporting of monitoring carried out in respect of the parameters and emission points specified in table S5.1 of schedule 5 which represents **compliance** with the environmental permit.

The monitoring returns submitted are for the reporting periods specified in table S5.1 of schedule 5 which represents **compliance** with the environmental permit.

The monitoring returns have not been submitted using the forms specified in table S5.4 of schedule 5 which represents **non-compliance** with the environmental permit. Alternative reporting formats have been used that have not been previously agreed in writing by the regulator. Given the evolving nature of a landfill operation, as new cells are developed and new monitoring points are added, we acknowledge that it is often impracticable to have fixed reporting forms. We are content for the operator to deviate from the forms specified in table S5.4 of schedule 5. We remind the operator that it is their responsibility to ensure that any reporting formats used provide for the reporting of all monitoring data required by permit condition 3.5.1.
