4. Details of our assessment

The purpose of this Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) is to record breaches of the environmental permit arising from the exceedance of permitted emission limits during **Q3 2020**.

Condition 3.2.3 of the environmental permit states:

The trigger levels for emissions into groundwater for the parameter(s) and monitoring point(s) set out in schedule 4 table S4.4 shall not be exceeded.

Table S4.4 of Schedule 4 to the environmental permit is partially reproduced below.

A Schedule 6 notification submitted to NRW on 13 October 2020 gives the measured Ammoniacal Nitrogen result at monitoring point GW5 on 28 September 2020 as 4.65 mg/l. This is an exceedance of permitted emission limits and represents **non-compliance** with the environmental permit.

As a result of this non-compliance a CCS Score C3 has been recorded against compliance sub-criteria (E)(2)

Condition 4.3.1 (b) of the environmental permit states:

*The Agency (sic) shall be notified without delay following the detection of:
(b) the breach of a limit specified in the permit.*

Condition 4.3.2 of the environmental permit states:

Any information provided under condition 4.3.1 shall be confirmed by sending the information listed in schedule 6 to this permit within the time period specified in that schedule.

Part A(b) of schedule 5 to the environmental permit requires NRW be notified **within 24 hours of detection** of an exceedance of permitted limit.

The operator notified the regulator of the exceedance of permitted emission limit(s) on 13 October 2020. The exceedance of permitted emission limit(s) was detected on 12 October 2020.
