	(A4) they notified us that the filters appeared dirty so as precaution we carried inspection and discovered deposits of coal on the clean side of the filters – the following day we changed the bags of the whole bay that were found to have coal deposits. We believe that this issue may have lead to the monitoring results given. Following on from their sampling work, CES issued their results report to us on the 24.9.2020. Their official verified data shows the particulates reading was 14.36mg/m4 which indicates a breach. However, this may have been as a result of dirty filter bags, which have now been changed. We are confident that this has addressed the issue and we are now conducting further investigations to gather some indicative measurements. CES have been invited back to site in mid-October to revalidate the tests. Once we have these results we will submit the Part B of this form to NRW with the revalidated results. We do not believe given the relatively low velocity of flow rate, that there have been any wider environmental impacts.
