Hi Patrick

It sounds like you will require a temporary works Licence from the Crown, which I can set up for you. If in the first instance you provide a plan of the works area and detail about what will be taking place within that area e.g. pedestrian works access, vehicular access, oversailing works, fencing on the foreshore, safety boat/buoy etc. then I will be able to provide further information regarding fees.

In due course, I will require confirmation from you as soon as possible to the following so that I can draft a Licence:

1. Name and address to be used on the Licence; please confirm full address and company number details – this should tie-up with any consents obtained.
2. Confirmation that Licence area is for temporary access/works only, and if necessary reinstatement to take place.
3. The Licence will be issued subject to all other statutory consents being obtained; you will need to make your own enquiries. Please supply information if applicable e.g. NRW Marine Licence No & copy of the consent, consent from CADW etc.
4. A copy of the final method statement for the works if available.
5. Confirmation of what access is required; vehicular? Pedestrian? Anything else? What size is the Team/Crew? What equipment will you have with you and be using?
6. Please may you provide a (min) 1:2500 scale plan marking the area(s) you require access to for the temporary works, and mark location of any relevant works details e.g. access routes.
7. Confirm estimated timescale for the works and commencement date and estimated end date.
8. Undertaking required for Licence fee and Agents fees. TBC

Dear Alice Lovegrove

I'm the palaeoenvironmental researcher with the EU Funded CHERISH Project (<http://cherishproject.eu/en/>) based at Aberystwyth University, investigating climate change on heritage sites around the Welsh and Irish coastlines. Over the past few years we have been conducting research at Dinas Dinlle, Morfa Dinlle, Llyn Coron and Llyn Maelog on Anglesey. We have identified a marine incursion about 7000 years ago in the sediments of Llyn Maelog. This event has sparked a lot of interest in the research community investigating and modelling early Holocene sea-level rise, but also it illustrates some of important issues relating to future sea-level rise. We have also conducted GPR over the dunes fronting the lake, detecting palaeo-lake surfaces below the sand. Furthermore, our Irish colleagues have filled in some of the bathymetry gaps off Traeth Llydan.

Recently we have been surveying the intertidal deposits at the Warren Beach Abersoch. Our Project colleagues at the Royal Commission identified significant intertidal peat exposures bearing the imprint of animal hoof prints and evidence of old peat cutting <https://coflein.gov.uk/en/site/421684/> in addition to the wood and peat which are more generally visible.

We believe there has been two distinct phases of tree/peat growth on the foreshore that may relate to early Holocene sea-level rise. We are seeking permission from the Crown Estate to take a core about 3metres long and 55mm in diameter in order to date the organic horizons and determine the source of the intervening minerogenic material. We would like to collect the core at grid reference around SH32032 29595 (see attached), which is just below mean high water.

I believe you act for the Crown Estate in this regard and can perhaps inform me how to make an application for permission. I am aware I will also require a Marine License from NRW for the activity. I have attached a map showing the location and a copy of the method we would be employing.
