

Measures taken, or intended to be taken, to stop the emission	No action was taken at the time of the releases as the breaches were identified on 19th September following receipt of the analytical results from the stack emissions monitoring contractor. The average of the three particulate runs gives a result of 8.7mg/m³ which is below the ELV and the average of the three ammonia runs gives a result of 10.1mg/m³ versus an ELV of 10 mg/m³. A response was provided in relation to Emission Point G on 31st August (in response to the Compliance Assessment Report), which detailed the work undertaken to date and the feasibility study regarding the installation of the new pump.
