Thank you for your email regarding the proposed grab/sediment samples for scientific research, and for confirming that no grab/sediment samples will be taken within IMO TSS in the study area.

I have assumed you are not using jack up barges, however if you are, when jacked should up exhibit signals in accordance with the UK standard Marking Schedule for Offshore Installations.

I can confirm that based on the information provided, and on the understanding that the following takes place, we would have no significant concerns to raise with regards to the safety of navigation, and we would expect the risk to navigation to be relatively low on this occasion:

1. All relevant maritime safety legislation is adhered to;
2. Issue local notifications to marine users, including fisherman's organisations, relevant authorities and other local stakeholders, to ensure that they are made fully aware of the activity at least five days before commencement of the works;
3. HM Coastguard are notified in advance via zone31@hmcg.gov.uk

Please can you confirm your acceptance of these requirements.

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Dear sir/Madam,

I am writing to check that the proposed activities for our Marine Band 1 licence application will not cause any undue navigational risk to sea traffic.

- The proposed work is to take grab/sediment samples for scientific research (Teaching).
Sites are yet to be determined but the application is in two parts ;
Part 1 – Teaching (Day trips) between Sept and December onboard the RV Prince Madog, samples will be taken within the area (see attached map 1).
Part II – Undergraduate and Postrgraduate projects, will happen throughout the year within the waters surrounding Anglesey and North wales (SEE attached MAP 2). This work will mainly be conducted on the smaller vessels Macoma /MYA using a hand operated grab with the occasional grab sample taken onboard the RV Prince Madog.
The vessel will disengage power and display the relevant shapes/lights under the COLREGS when on station.
Sampling time will be less than 10minutes per station.
Average sample size will be 0.002m^3(2ltrs) onboard the RV Prince Madog and 0.0005m^3(0.5ltrs)onboard the smaller vessels
Samples will not be taken from Sensitive, protected or historical areas.
