We believe that the company has committed the following offence(s):

Offence: Regulation 38(2) of The Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016 – failure to comply with or to contravene an environmental permit condition.

We will take this offence into account if we consider that The Company is involved in any future offending.

- affect our right to issue enforcement, clear-up or remediation notices, or seek recovery of costs or damages according to law.
