4. Details of our assessment

Quarter 2 2021 Returns Review

Performance - Operating hours between 01/04/2021 and 30/06/2021 were 3697 hours with 1 period of abnormal operations recorded. There have been 0.5 hours of abnormal operation cumulative for the year to date.

Air Emissions - CO emission limit is now varied from 100mg/m³ as half hourly average to 150mg/m³ as a 10-minute average in line with the Industrial Emissions Directive Annex VI, Part 3.
