4. Details of our assessment

INCIDENT

On the 09 August 2021 we received a pollution report that grey water was being discharged from the outlet of the Wiston Sewage Treatment Works (STW) and being passed into the nearby stream. The received waters are a tributary of the Fenton brook. The water was described as having an odour and that there was sewage fungus present.

It was identified that the STW was operated by Pembrokeshire County Council (PCC). Pollution Control Officers from PCC were then notified.

Chris Roscoe, Environment Officer attended the site later that same day and found grey discharge emanating from the STW discharge pipe. Photos and samples were taken from this area for analysis. Samples and relevant documents were left within the PCC STW compound. Officer from PCC were notified of what was found, however reported that enquiries were made with the "Area Maintenance Team and they are unaware of any PCC asset in that area". A photo of the site board showing the PCC ownership and a description of the permit was then shared with PCC officers to confirm operational responsibility for the site.

RESOLUTION

Follow-up discussions with PCC Pollution Officers reported that the issue of the 09 August had been with a failure of the treatment process' Recirc pump: by the 23 August this had been replaced. Further checks were planned following this work to assess the condition of other onsite equipment.

FURTHER ACTIONS

To resolve this CARS Warning Letter please respond to the following queries:

1. On the date of the incident it was reported by PCC that the Asset Maintenance Team were unaware of this site and PCC's responsibilities with respect to its maintenance and operation. Please explain how this oversight occurred and how this will be mitigated in future.
2. Please confirm the maintenance and assessment program now being applied to this site.
3. We advise that PCC refamiliarize themselves with other PCC STW sites and discharge permits to avoid similar issues at other locations.
