3. What will happen next?

Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

At this time, we do not intend to take any further action.

4. Details of our assessment

On 7 October 2021 a site inspection was carried out at Fenestration Recycling Company Ltd permitted site to assess compliance with the Regulation 36 Notice which had been issued to ensure the site was storing waste in line with the block plan and associated Fire Prevention and Mitigation Plan. The inspection was carried out by Sally Wakeford (NRW) and Darren Rees (FRS), and accompanied on site by Steve Hemmings from Fenestration.

The Regulation 36 Notice expired on 30 September 2021 and due to a short-term fuel crisis NRW were unable to visit on this date. Photographs were provided by the site to show the installation of the fire break in the rear yard. Once restrictions were lifted a site inspection was conducted to better understand the layout of the wastes on site.

A fire break had been placed in the centre of the large pile of waste on the left-hand side. Although a pile had partially collapsed the fire break was reinstalled.

There were 3 main piles along the left-hand side of the site, and one on the right. This is consistent with the layout on site.

The site could benefit from some further housekeeping, especially around the side of the building where there were some small piles on the floor. Other materials, such as coverings for the outgoing products, could also do with being provided dedicated storage space to ensure fire breaks in the wastes remain.

The overall risk the site poses in this rear yard area has been reduced, waste has been removed, other piles rearranged, and waste is no longer stored close to the railway bridge. The piles of waste also appear to have been reduced. Steve informed us that these piles were being worked through.

The layout of different waste types could use some improvement, as dusts from the process were not in separate piles from waste to be reprocessed.

Progress on the removal of the waste to the left of the site in the top yard (before the railway bridge) has been slowed due to a number of reasons. The step on the Section 59 Notice was extended as requested. It could be seen that there was a large reduction in the amount of waste stored at this location and has been reprocessed.

Progress on removal of legacy wastes from the site has been slow, however progress has been made, and improvements in the site are being noted.

The final deadline of the Section 59 Notice has not been amended.
