Our determination of your application to vary your permit to include newly prescribed activities is complete. Your permit has been varied from Standard Rules SR2010 No16, on-farm anaerobic digestion facility including use of the resultant biogas (waste facility) , to Standard Rules SR2012 No9, on-farm anaerobic digestion facility using farm waste only, including use of the resultant biogas (Installation). This will allow you to operate above IED threshold limits.

We're satisfied that you can continue to carry out your activities in accordance with the variation, without harm to the environment or human health. I enclose a notice showing the changes to your permit. Please keep this in a safe place with your other permit records.

Rights of appeal

If you are not happy with any permit condition that has been imposed by the variation you may appeal to the Welsh Ministers. If you want to appeal any condition imposed as a result of your application you must make your appeal no later than six months from the date of the variation notice. If you want to appeal any condition we've added as an Natural Resources Wales initiated variation you must make your appeal no later than two months from the date of the notice.
