Display Recycling Limited

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Surrender

We have decided to accept the surrender of the permit for Rhydymwyn CRT Recycling operated by Display Recycling Limited.

The permit number is EPR-ZP3634CG

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid any pollution risk and to return the site to a satisfactory state.

We consider in reaching that decision we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements.

Purpose of this document

- provides a record of the decision-making process
- shows how all relevant factors have been taken into account

Receipt of application

Application for surrender

We have accepted the full surrender of the environmental permit held by Display Recycling Limited. The operator applied for a surrender on the 4th September 2018, the application was initially not duly made as an incorrect declaration had been signed. The application was duly made on the 15th October 2017. Prior to the application, the operator was in contact with local NRW officers to discuss the surrender. It was mentioned in the discussions that Display Recycling Limited clarified with NRW that the site was classed as a low-risk, and in turn the surrender application can be deemed low-risk. The document “CAR_NRW0033421” explains what the officer and the applicant discussed. The applicant has also submitted a document named “Low Risk Surrender of Permit EPR – Display Recycling” which provides supporting information for the surrender. NRW reviewed the report in line with the principles in ‘Regulatory Guidance Note 9: Surrender’ and concluded that the information presented in the report indicates that the site is in a ‘satisfactory state’.

The facility

Control of the facility

We are satisfied that the applicant (now the operator) is the person who will have control over the operation of part of the facility after the grant of the permit. The decision was taken in accordance with EPR RGN 1 Understanding the meaning of operator.

The site

The permitted site houses a watertight warehouse with an impermeable concrete floor. The drainage from the yard is via a central channel which is protected by two sediment tanks. There was no dismantling, processing or environmental spills in the yard and the yard surface has been maintained in good condition throughout the life of the permit, there is no environmental risk and this has been recognised as a Low Risk Surrender.

Pollution risk

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid a pollution risk resulting from the operation of the regulated facility.

Satisfactory state

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to return the site of the regulated facility to a satisfactory state.

In coming to this decision, we have had regard to the state of the site before the facility was put into operation.

Conclusion

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid a pollution risk resulting from the operation of the regulated facility. We are also satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to return the site of the regulated facility to a satisfactory state. In coming to this decision, we have had regard to the state of the site before the facility was put into operation. An NRW officer has also been to the site to confirm work has been completed to return the site to a satisfactory state.
